III. Use of Personal Information

The CCPA outlines several business and commercial purposes for collecting, using, and disclosing Personal Information. - Detecting security incidents, protecting against deceptive, fraudulent, malicious, or illegal activity, and suing those responsible for that activity.
- Restoring to identify and repair errors that impair existing intended functionality.
- Reviewing related to a current interaction with you and coexisting transactions, such as auditing compliance with this specification and other standards.
- Short-term, transient use.
- Undertaking activities to confirm or maintain the quality or safety of our services, and to expand, upgrade, or enhance our services.
- Undertaking internal research for technological development and demonstration.
- For other purposes for which we provide specific notice at the time the information is collected.

IV. Collection and Disclosure of Personal Information

In the preceding twelve months we have collected Personal Information from general sources including you, your use of our services, your devices, our affiliates, our vendors, and our service providers. More specific information about Personal Information we collect is laid out in this notice and in our Privacy Policy, which we update from time to time.

As also explained in our Privacy Policy, we share your Personal Information with the following categories of CCPA third parties:

- Affiliates.
- Third parties as required by law and similar disclosures.
- Third parties integrated into our services.
- Vendors and service providers, including for data analytics and marketing and advertising our services to you.
- Other third parties for whom we have obtained your permission to disclose your Personal Information.

V. Your California Privacy Rights

If you are a California resident, you may exercise these rights:

Right to Delete. Subject to certain exceptions, you have the option to delete Personal Information about you that we have collected from you.

Right to Equal Service and Price. You have the right not to receive discriminatory treatment for the exercise of your CCPA privacy rights, subject to certain limitations.

Right to Know and Access. You may submit a verifiable request for information regarding the:

- · Categories of Personal Information collected or disclosed by us;
- Purposes for which categories of Personal Information are collected by us;
- · Categories of sources from which we collect Personal Information; and
- Specific pieces of Personal Information we have collected about you during the past twelve months.

Shine the Light. We do not rent, sell, or share your Personal Information with non-affiliated companies for their direct marketing purposes, unless we have your permission.

Verification. Requests for access to or deletion of Personal Information are subject to our ability to reasonably verify your identity in light of the information requested and pursuant to relevant CCPA requirements, limitations, and regulations.
